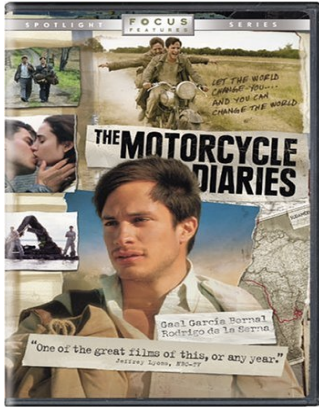
Samsara

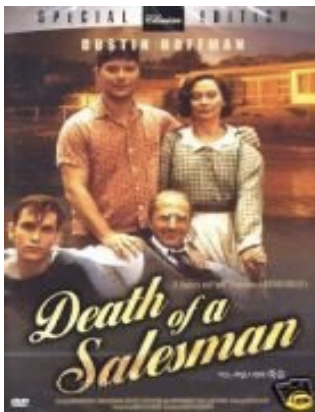
Brain Games: Seasons 1 - 3

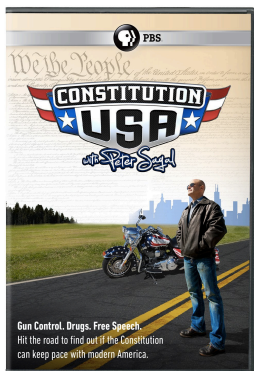
The Motorcycle Diaries (2004)

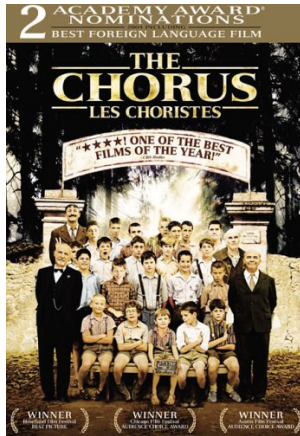
