Energize learning and teaching with funding for creative experiences and projects through Faculty Innovation Grants – 161 faculty and staff funded since 2007 (most at \$1,000 each) approximately half the number of proposals received.

Expand global/cultural/socio-political/environmental understanding through Student Travel Fellowships – 54 awarded (averaging \$1,500 each) since 2010. Nearly 200 students applying since 2010 did not receive fellowships and many others did not apply because the trip is completely out of their financial reach.

Reward seniors' talents and aspirations and make higher education more affordable with Scholarships — expansion from 2 in 2011 to 27 for the Class of 2016 (\$500 -\$2,200 each) chosen from nearly 225 of our talented and motivated applicants who did *not* receive the help of FoCRLS.
