In order to be considered for the program, all Cambridge youth TeenWorks applicants must meet the following criteria:

- Cambridge resident or Cambridge Rindge & Latin School student
- Be 16 21 years old and attending high school or up to second year of college
- Have and maintain an acceptable attendance/tardiness record
- Be eligible and willing to work at least 8-12 hours per week
- Have the support of family to participate in the program
