The YWLC day camp brings together a diverse group of young female leaders who go through a curriculum partly based on the YWCA and United Nations program "Empowering Young Women to Lead Change" and the United States Institute of Peace. Each year, we focus on honing in on leadership and empowerment skills and in helping attendees gain actionable skills to become better agents of change. The YWLC program covers topics such as leadership, women in STEM programs (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math), personal development, financial literacy, human rights, activism, and global citizenship. The camp includes visits from prominent guest lecturers and interactions with successful leaders who have generated change in their communities.

The YWLC Summer Program promises to be an amazing summer experience that will help you unleash your inner leader, network, and live up to the greatness that already resides in you! After camp, each participant will be part of **The YWLC Alumni Network**, which is comprised of passionate women from all over the world, and be required to do 20 volunteer hours with YWLC throughout the next school year to receive a certificate.

Upon completion each participant will receive a certificate of achievement and become a member of Pangea's YWLC Alumni Network. Each graduate will also gain the privilege of being invited to future meetings and events. Additionally, each participant in the camp is required to commit to working on a service project throughout the following school year focused on inciting positive change and be proactive in the Alumni Network.
