Participatory Budgeting in Cambridge

What is Participatory Budgeting (PB)?

Participatory budgeting is a democratic process in which community members directly decide how to spend part of a public budget. Residents making real decisions about real money.

The goals of Cambridge's pilot PB project are to directly involve residents in the budgeting and city-building process, foster civic engagement and community spirit, and help ensure that the City's capital plan reflects the priorities of Cambridge residents.

How much money is Cambridge setting aside and what can it be used for?


The City is setting aside \$500,000 in capital funds for the 2014-2015 pilot PB process. Projects are eligible for funding if they:

- ✓ Benefit the public. Projects that only benefit private individuals or groups are not eligible.
- ✓ Are a one-time expenditure that can be completed with funds from this year's PB process.
- ✓ Are implemented by the City of Cambridge on public property.

Examples of Eligible and Ineligible Project Ideas:

ELIGIBLE	INELIGIBLE
Street and sidewalk paving	 Hiring additional police and firefighters
Community garden	Extending hours at the library
Park renovations	Grants to community organizations
• Redesigning an intersection to make it	Early childhood education programs
safer	A block party of community event
Bike racks and shelters	Running a youth basketball league
Replacing playground equipment
