Description:

The three year 21st Century Community Learning Center grant is entering its 3rd year of implementation. The Putnam Avenue Upper School (PAUS) /East End House (EEH) Out-of-School-time (OST) Partnership Program will continue to focus on engaging with and addressing the needs of at-risk PAUS students, assisting them with meeting their learning and developmental goals and contributing to meeting CPS Improvement Goals. A .60 FTE Data and Grant Projects Specialist will provide administrative support to fulfill all grant requirements and deadlines, including attending periodic statewide and regional meetings, administering data collection tools including surveys and other site-based assessments, and preparing grant reports.
