

## Description:

The purpose of this program is to advance the skills of educators involved with students with disabilities through high-quality, sustained, and intensive professional development activities. With these funds, educators will develop a least restrictive environment protocol to determine the needs of students during each annual IEP meeting; they will also participate in professional learning communities facilitated by Dr. Marilyn Friend throughout the school year, focused on developing common language and practices for students with disabilities in the general education classroom. Educators and instructional leaders will also participate in training on the principles of universal design for learning (UDL) to redesign general and special education classroom settings and implement the three principles by the fall 2015 to improve math and literacy skills for students with disabilities.
