STUDENT HEALTH SERVICES AND REQUIREMENTS

Activities may include identification of student health needs, health screening tests (including vision, eye and hearing and dental screening tests and body mass index), infectiouseommunicable disease prevention and control, promotion of the correction of remediable health defects, emergency care of the ill and injured, health counseling, health and safety education, and the maintenance of a healthlyful school environment.

The school district recognizes that parents/guardians have the primary responsibility for the health of their students. The school will cooperate with appropriate professional organizations associated with maintaining individual and community health and safety.


The school district shall provide the services of a medical consultant School Health Physician who shall render medial and administrative consultative services for personnel responsible for school health and athletics. School Health Services are provided by the Cambridge Health Department with oversight by the Medical Director, RN Clinical Manager and Senior Director of Public Health Nursing Services.

Procedures for Emergency at School

<u>Unlicensed School</u> personnel shall give only emergency care to students who become ill or injured on school property, buses, or while under school supervision in the absence of a school nurse.

Each year parents/guardians shall supply information indicating where the student is to be taken in case of an emergency; the name, address, and phone number of an neighborindividual to be contacted in case the parent/guardian is not available; and any allergies or diseases the student might have.

The school district shall maintain a Medical Emergency Response Plan, as required by law, and an <u>Emergency Operations PlanProcedures Handbook</u> which shall be utilized by school district personnel for handling emergencies. Emergency procedures shall include the following:

Prompt reporting by teachers and any other school staff to the principal/head of upper school or designee and school nurse any accident or serious illness and such reports will be filed with the Safety and Security Office and the Chief Operating Officer Business Office.

Student Illness or Injury

In case of illness or injury, the parent or guardian will be contacted and asked to call for the student or provide the transportation.

Transportation of an ill or injured student is not normally to be provided by the school. If the parent/guardian cannot provide transportation of a student to the hospital and the student is ill or injured and in need of medical treatment, an ambulance may be called. Expense incurred as a result of emergency ambulance use will not be borne by the school district.

Transportation of a student by school personnel will be done only in an emergency and by the individual so designated by the school administrator.
