Demographic Data Executive Summary

Notes About Data Collection

The demographic data used in this report was downloaded from the Cambridge Public School Starbase System at the end of January 2003. Only students whose status was **Active** at that time were used in compiling this report. Consequently, figures may differ from those reported by the district to the MASS DOE in October of 2002.

Enrollment Changes

For the third consecutive year, the number of students enrolled in the Cambridge Public Elementary Schools decreased by approximately 200 students.

Racial/Ethnic Enrollments

The racial/ethnic composition of the district changed from that of the 2001/2002 academic year. Proportionally, the percentage of White students enrolled was lower in 2002/2003. In 2001/2002 39% of the students enrolled were White; in 2002/2003 only 37% were. During the 2002/2003 school year of this report, 63% of the students enrolled in the Cambridge Public Elementary Schools were students of color in comparison with 61% in 2001/2002 and 60% in 1999/2000 and 2000/2001. Throughout this report the racial category, Black, is reported as two separate groups. African American students are those students whose race is black, were born in the US and in whose homes English is the language most often spoken. Other Black students are those whose race is black and who were either not born in the US and/or in whose homes English is not the language most often spoken.

Free/Reduced Lunch Program, Special Education, and Limited English Proficiency

The percentage of students enrolled in the free/reduced lunch program within the district was higher than last year (45% vs. 41%), but lower than in previous years (99/00 47% and 00/01 48%). The percentage of students enrolled in the Free and Reduced Lunch Program is not evenly distributed across the district. There is a group of 4 schools, which have between 61% and 68% of their students enrolled whereas there is another group of 6 schools with only 23% to 34% of their students are enrolled in the Free and Reduced Lunch program.

The percentage of students enrolled in special education programs has decreased over the past four years, but proportionally that percentage has remained consistent (20%) for the past three years. The percentage of students with special needs varied by school; some schools had between 28 and 30 percent of their students in special programs, whereas one school had only 7%.

Students who cannot do regular class work in English are classified as having Limited English Proficiency (LEP). The district-wide percentage of LEP students in 2002/2003 was 10%. The percentage of LEP students has decreased over the past four years from 13% to 10% of students enrolled.

Performance and Outcome Data Executive Summary

Notes About Data Collection

Retention, Absence and Suspension data was all downloaded from the Starbase System at the end of the 2002/2003 school year. The Early Literacy Assessment data was collected by the Early Childhood Education Office, merged with the CPS database and analyzed by this office. The Algebra Exam data, collected by the Math Department, was merged with the CPS database and analyzed by this office.

Retentions

The percentage of students retained (1.6%) remained consistent with previous school years. Significantly more students with free and reduced school lunch were retained than those who paid for their lunches. The majority of students (52%) retained were in the second grade.

Attendance

The median number of absences for all elementary students stayed the same. In 2002/2003, the median number of absent days was 6; in other words, the student attendance rate was 97%. Hispanic students and Kindergarten students were more likely to be absent than other student groups.

Suspensions

The percentage of Out-of-School suspensions (1.5%) decreased since 1999/2000 and remained the same as last year. The percentage of In-School suspensions (1.5%) increased from last year and was slightly higher than in 1999/2000. The percentage of In-District suspensions (.9%) decreased from last year, but was slightly higher than in 1999/2000. African Americans and Other Black students were more likely to be suspended than other racial/ethnic groups, and students with special education plans were also more likely to be suspended.

Dropouts

The dropout rate increased slightly at CRLS (3.4%, 64 students). The dropout rates for the elementary schools are calculated on the number of students from each elementary school. The elementary school attended is based on the eighth grade year of attendance for each student. The highest dropout rates in 2002/2003 were from the Kennedy (1.4%,

5 students), Harrington (1.1%, 2 students) and the Tobin (1.0%, 4 students). The largest group of high school who dropped out of CRLS (38 students) did not attend the Cambridge Public schools in the eighth grade.

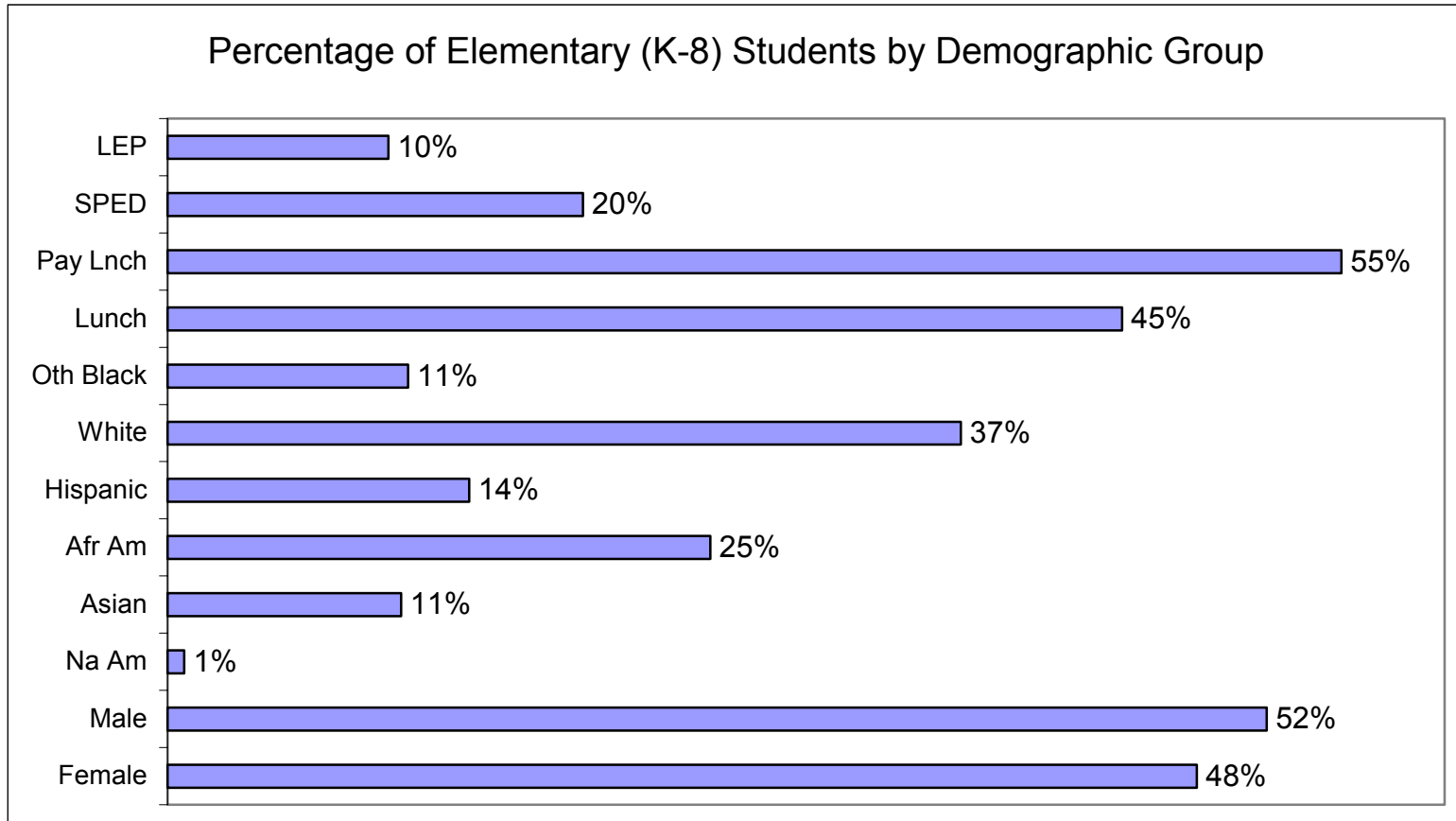
Early Literacy Assessment

- **Reading.** In 2002/2003, the benchmark for reading at grade level was changed. In previous years, the benchmark was based on instructional level DRA scores; this year the benchmark was based on independent reading level DRA scores. Consequently, there was a decrease in the percentage of first grade students reading on grade level from previous years (57% vs. 73%, 66%, and 71%). Likewise, the percentage of second grade students reading on grade level decrease from previous years (69% vs. 77%, 84%, and 84%). The changing of the reading benchmark had a greater effect on the percentage of African-American students reading at grade level than other racial groups.
- **Writing.** A significantly higher percentage of students were writing on grade level in first grade in 2002/2003 than in previous years (66% vs. 48%, 37%, and 46%). In second grade, the percentage of students writing on grade level was higher than in 2001/2002, but similar to years previous (36% vs. 24%, 32%, and 39%).

Algebra Exam

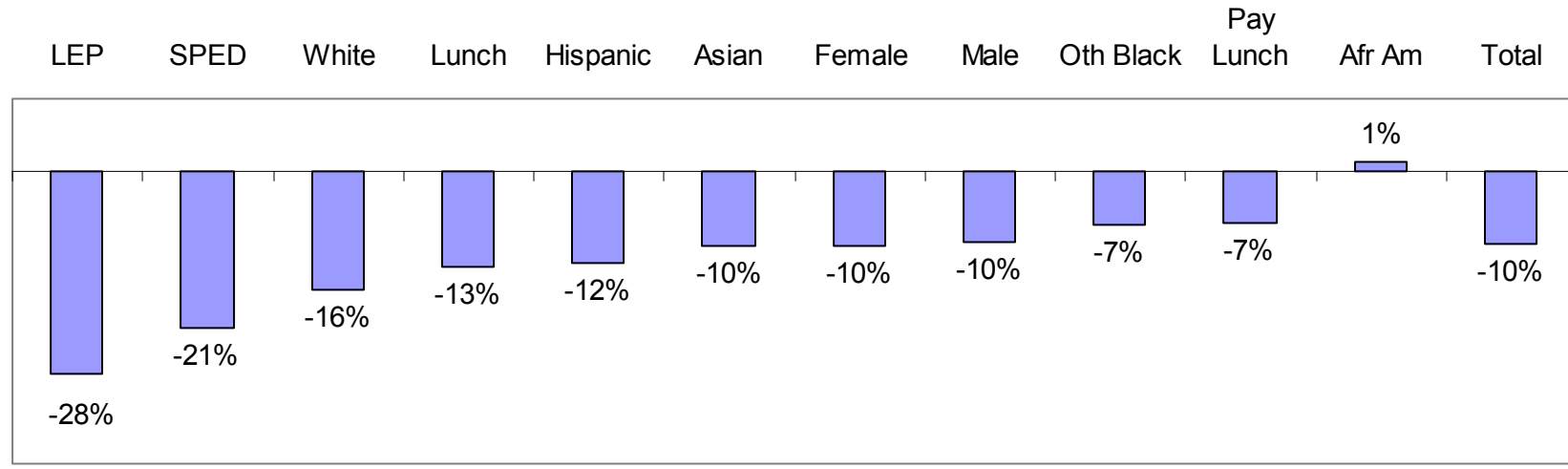
- In 2002/2003, 86% of 7th grade students passed the Algebra Exam; however only 7 schools reported their results. On the 8th grade Algebra Exam, 84% of the students passed the exam; however only 8 schools reported their results. Comparisons to previous years cannot reliably be made since data was not collected from all schools in 2002/2003.

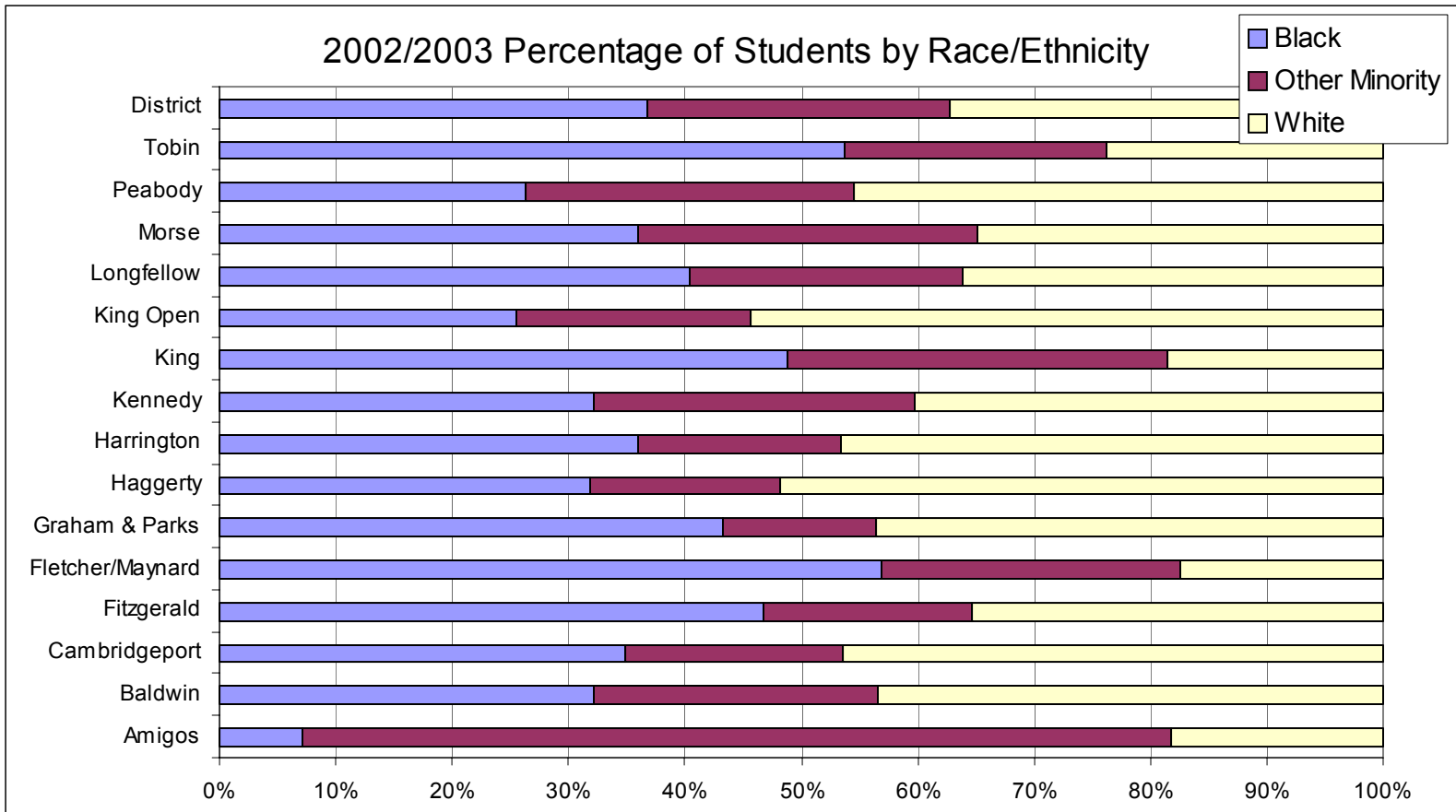

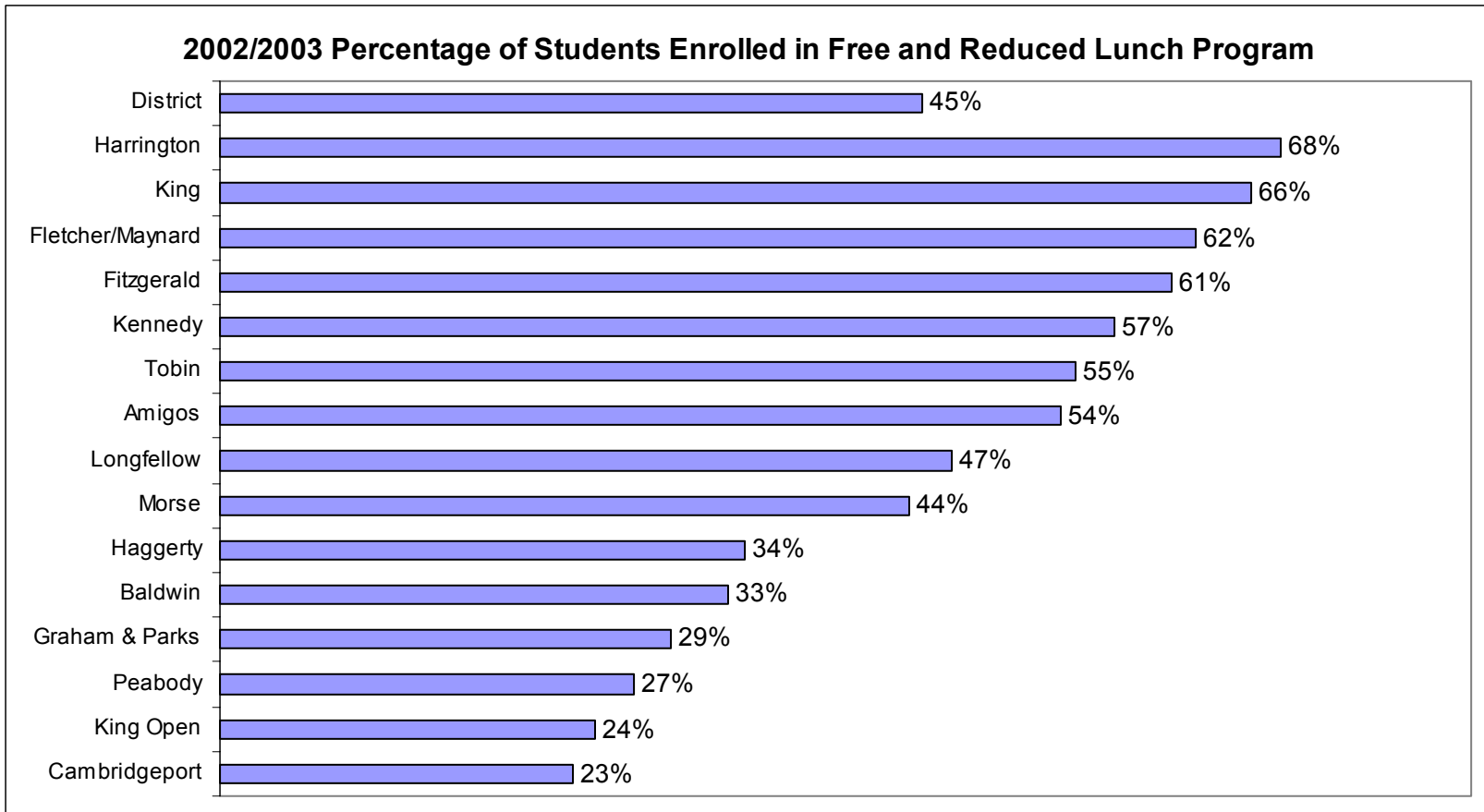

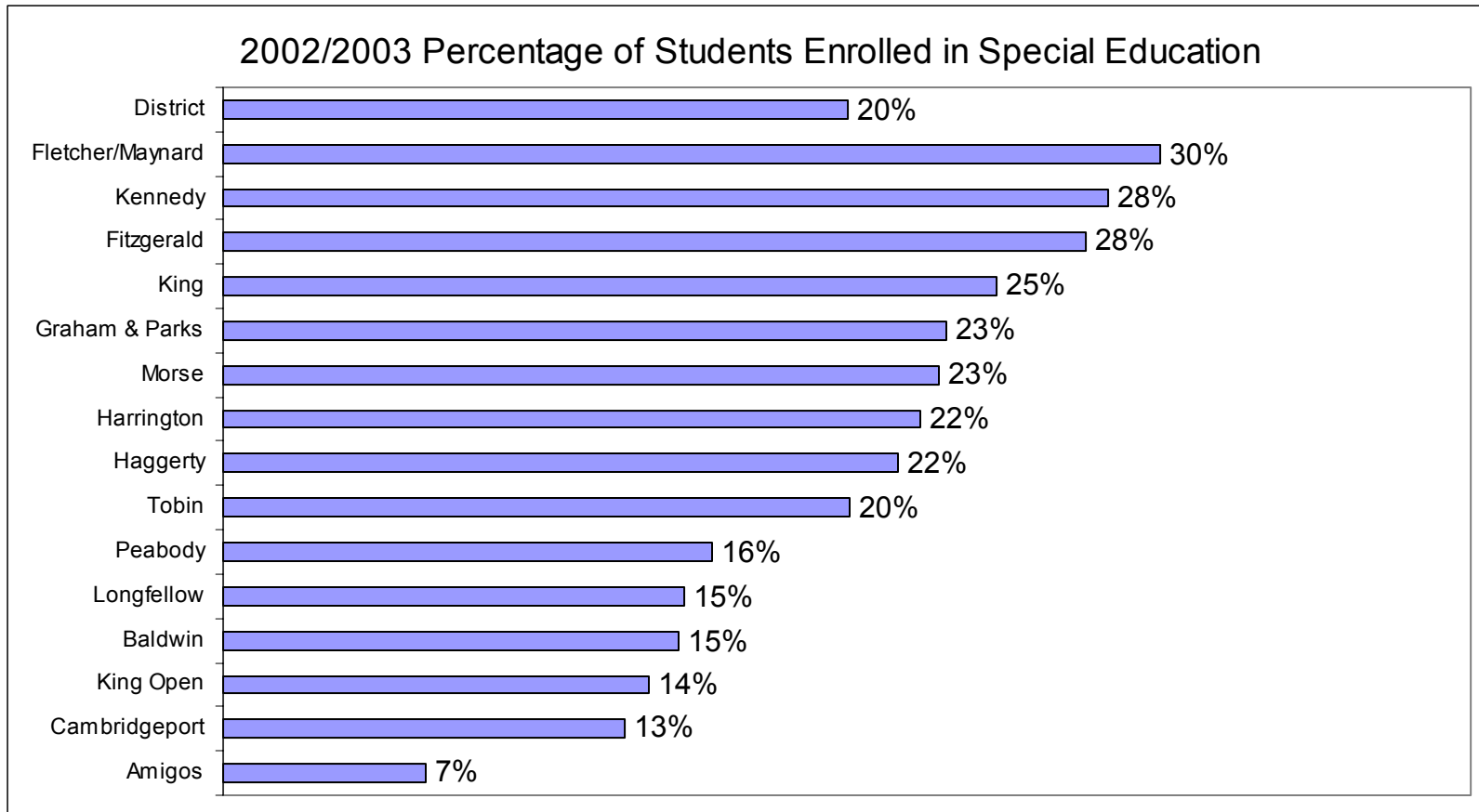
District Elementary (K-8) Racial/Ethnic Composition



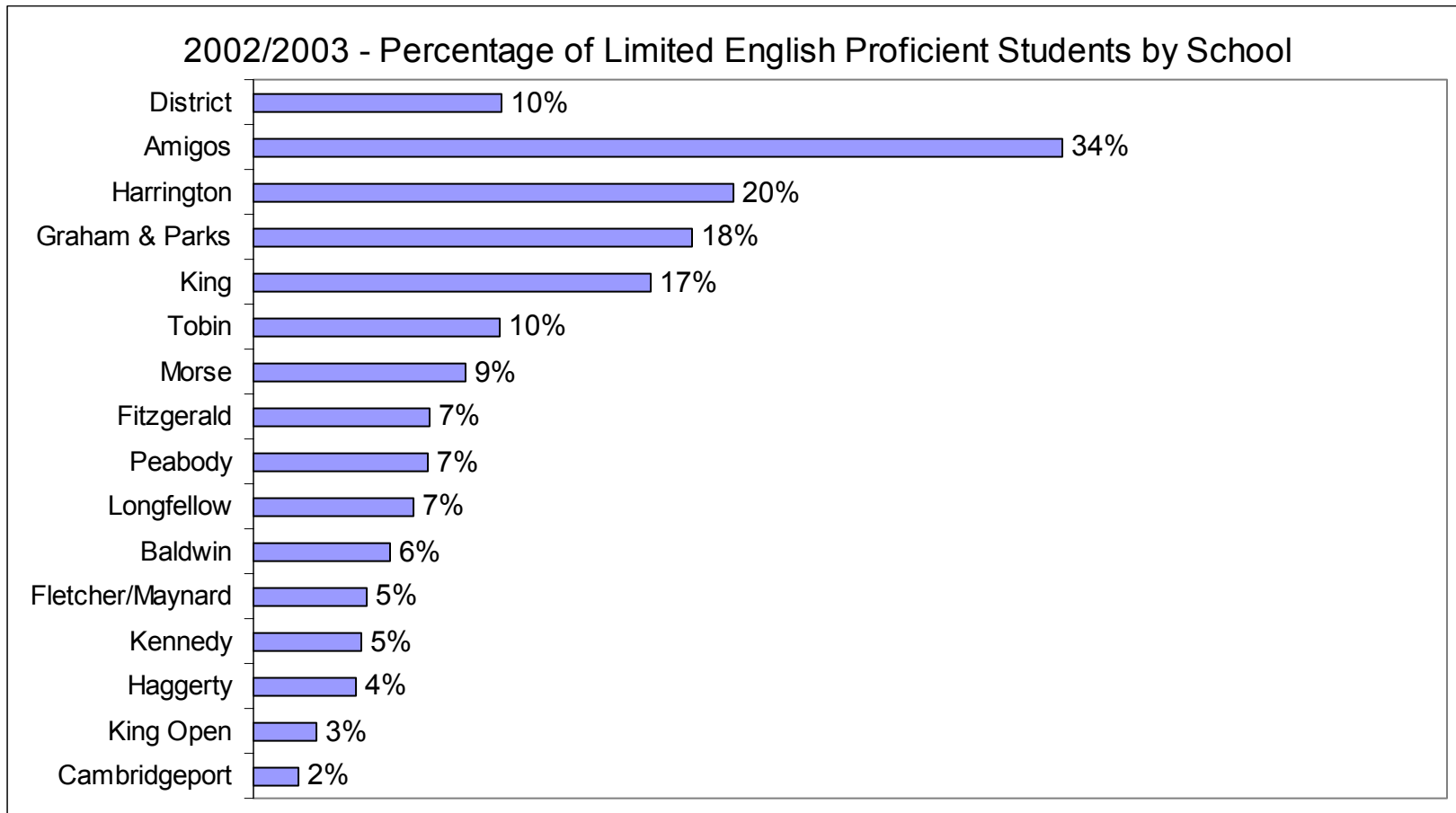
District Elementary (K-8) Enrollment in Free and Reduced Lunch Program



District Elementary (K-8) Enrollment in Special Education Programs



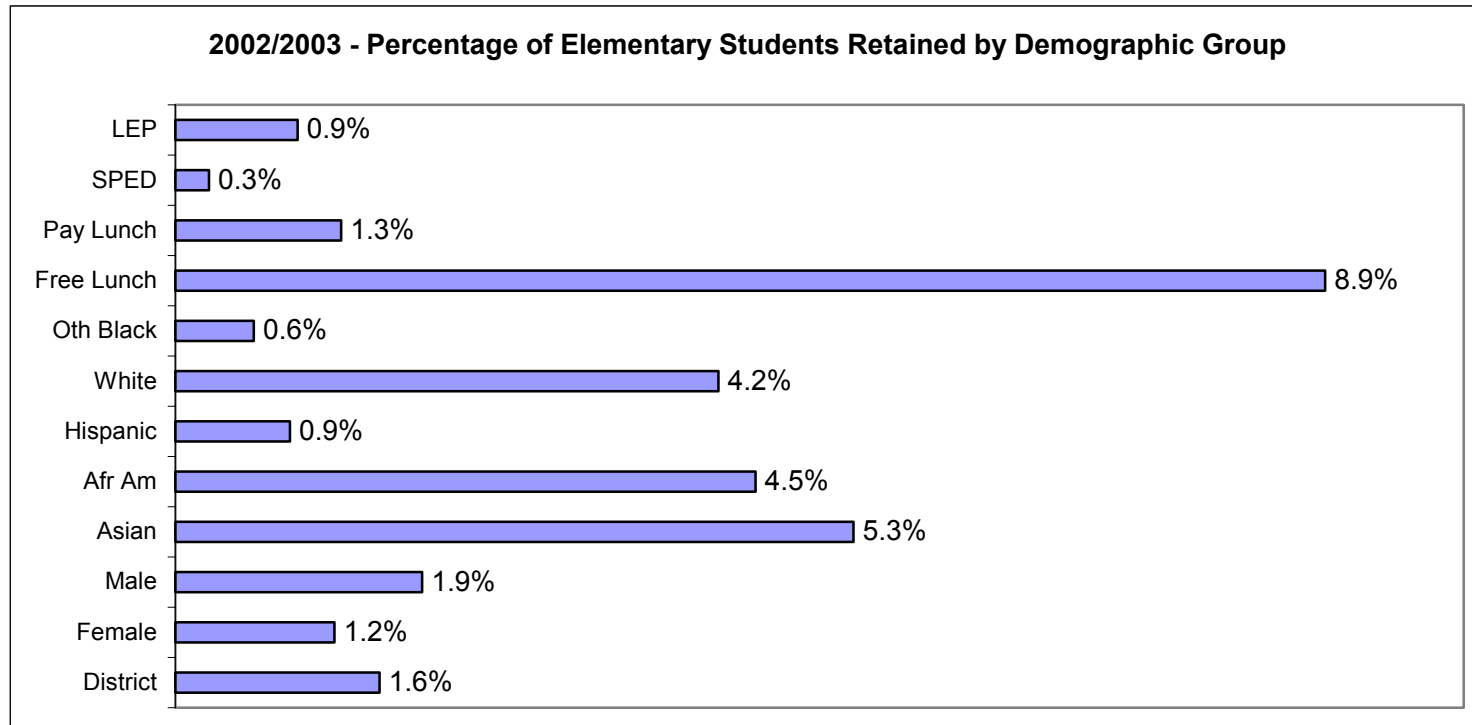
District Elementary (K-8) Limited English Proficient Students



PERFORMANCE AND OUTCOME DATA

Retentions

- 77 students (K-8) were retained in 2002/2003, which is 1.6% of the total students enrolled.
- **In 2001/2002**, 88 students were retained (1.7% of the K-8 elementary students). **In 2000/2001**, 85 students were retained (1.6% of elementary students). **In 1999/2000**, 85 students were also retained (1.6% of the K-8 elementary students).
- **By grade** – no kindergarten students were retained ; 3 first grade students (.6%); 40 second grade students (7.6%); 13 third grade students (2.7%); 14 fourth grade student (2.8%); 2 fifth grade students (.4%); 1 sixth grade student (.2%); 2 eighth grade students (.4%), and 2 ungraded students (3.3%) were retained.

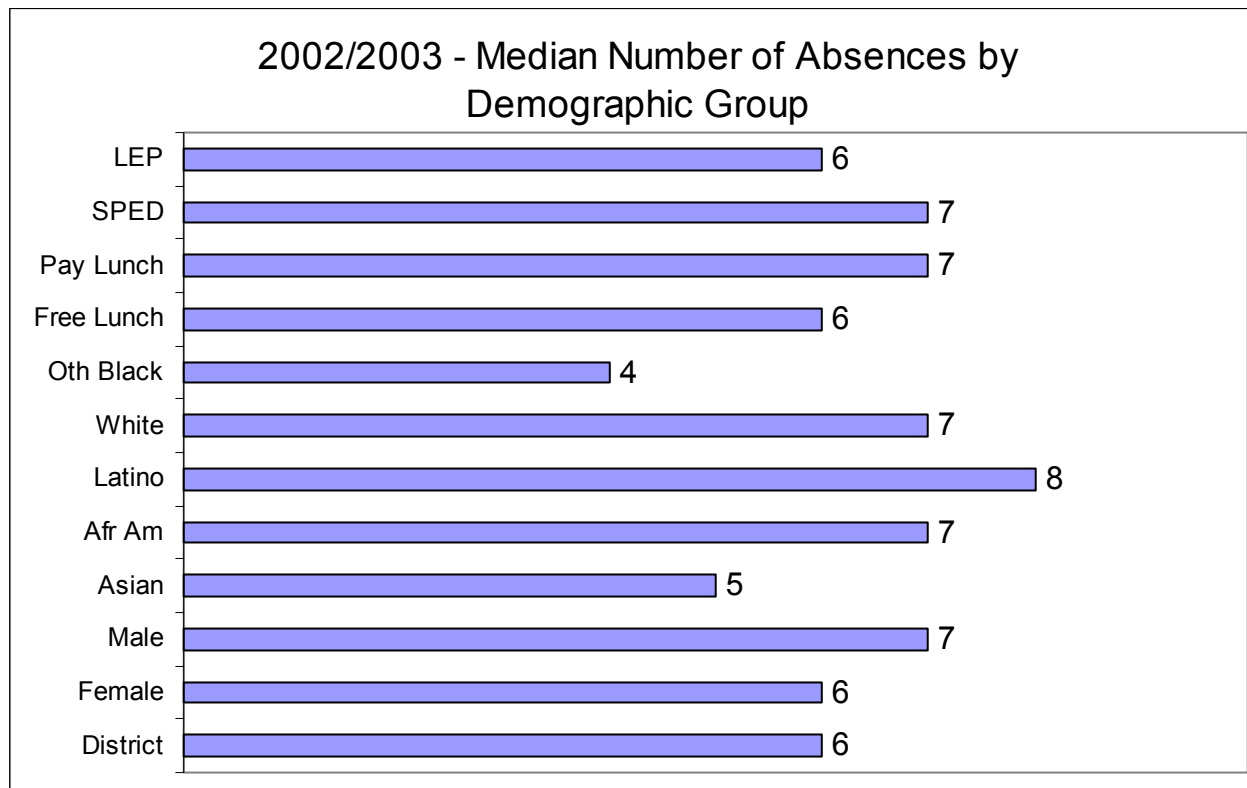

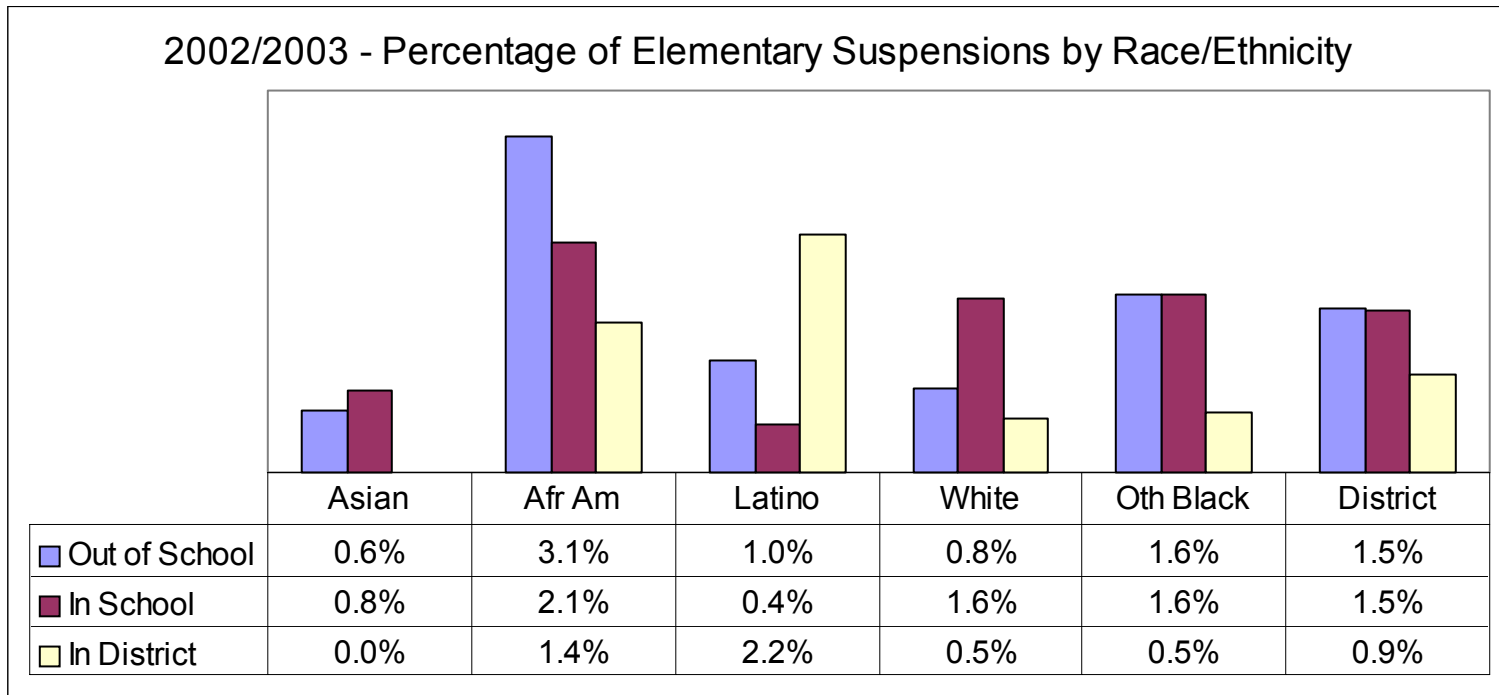

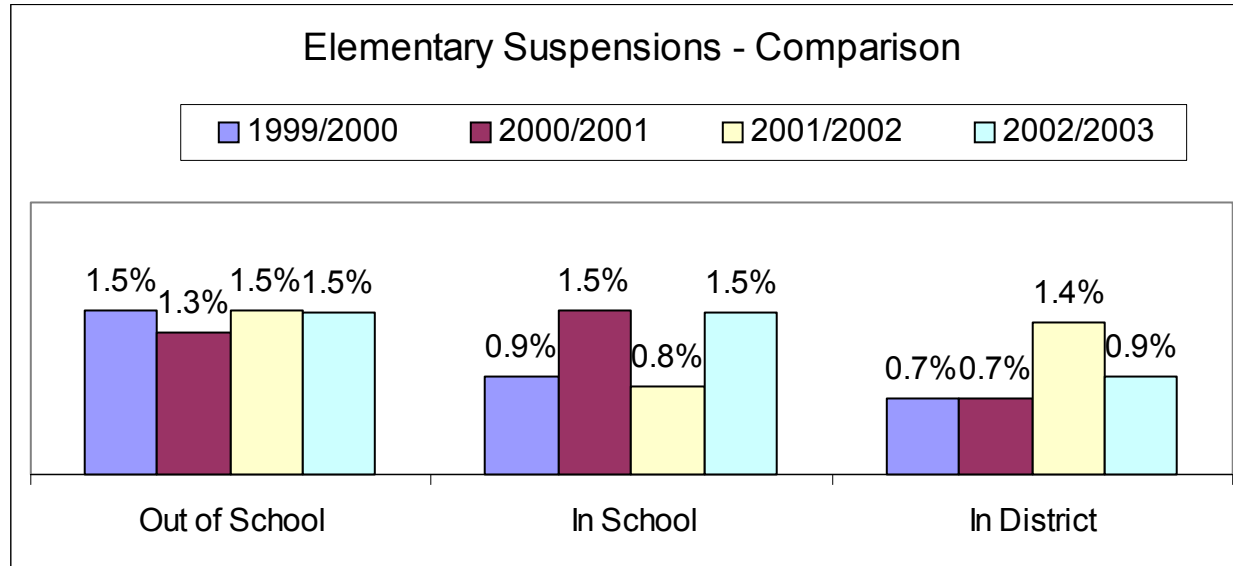

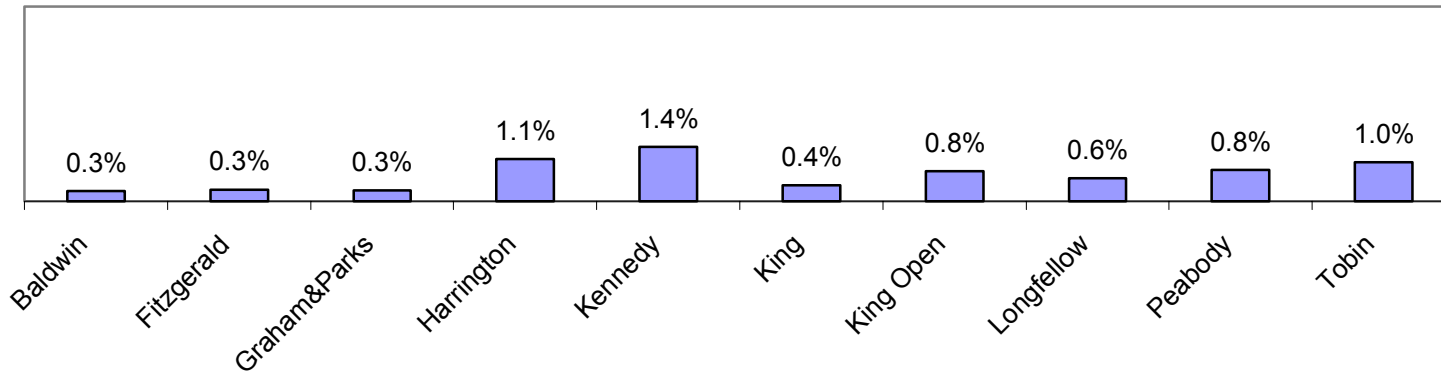

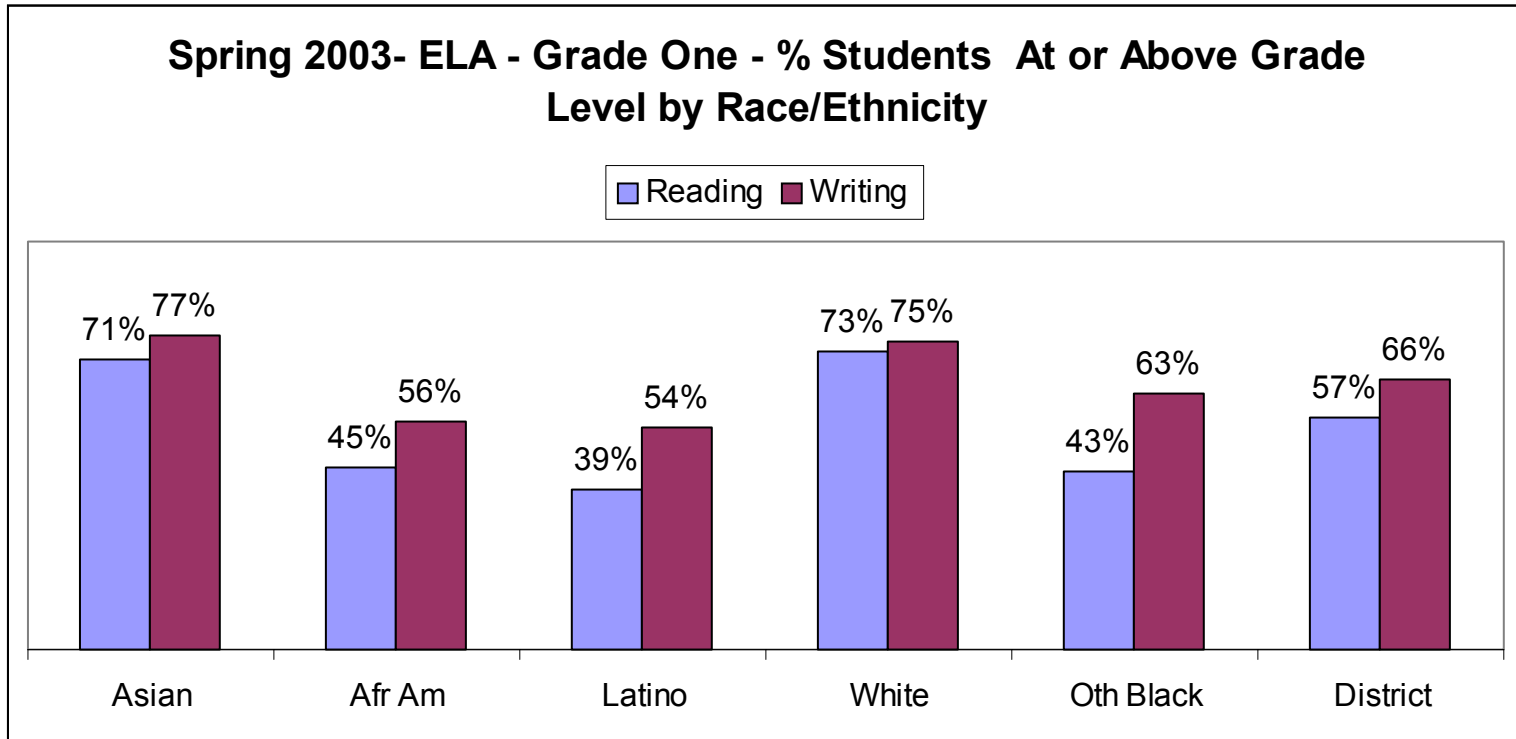

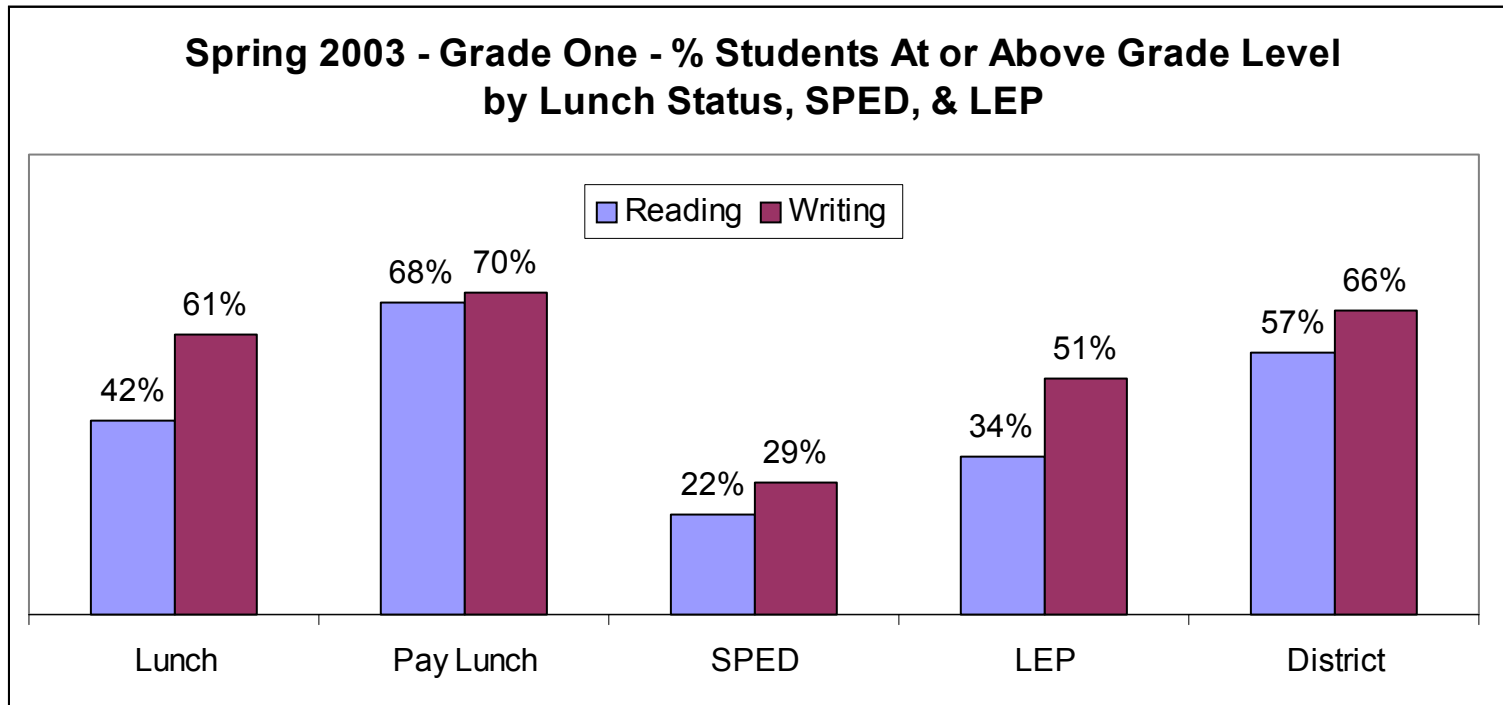

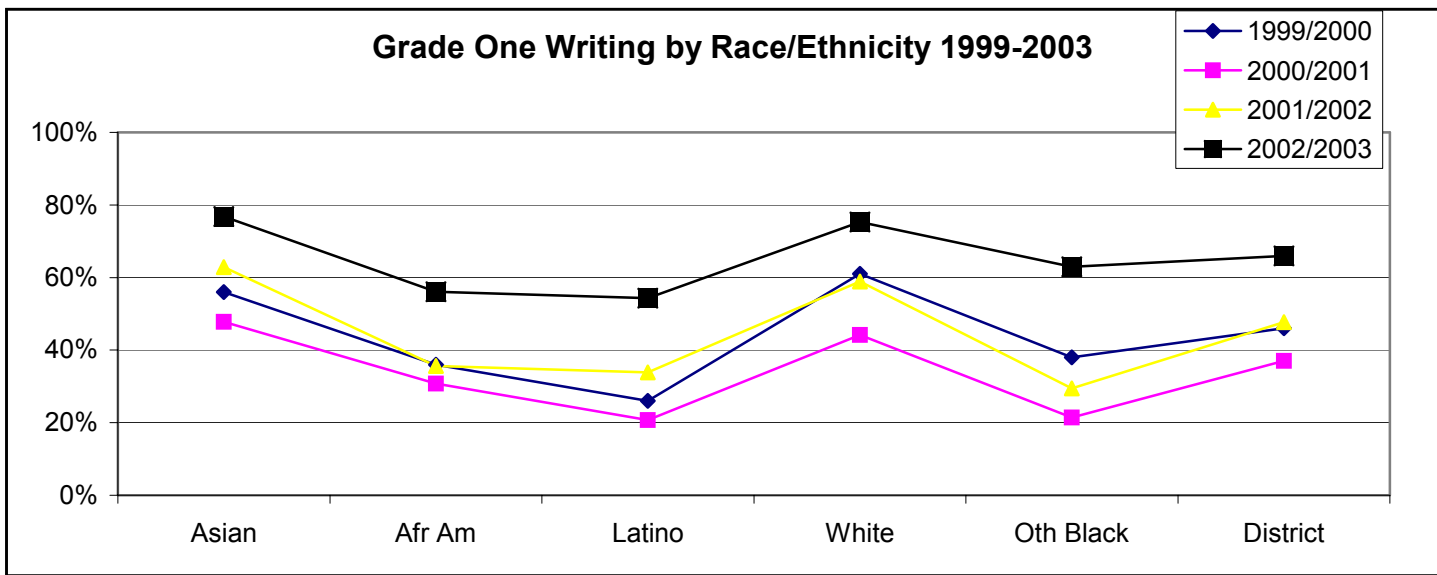
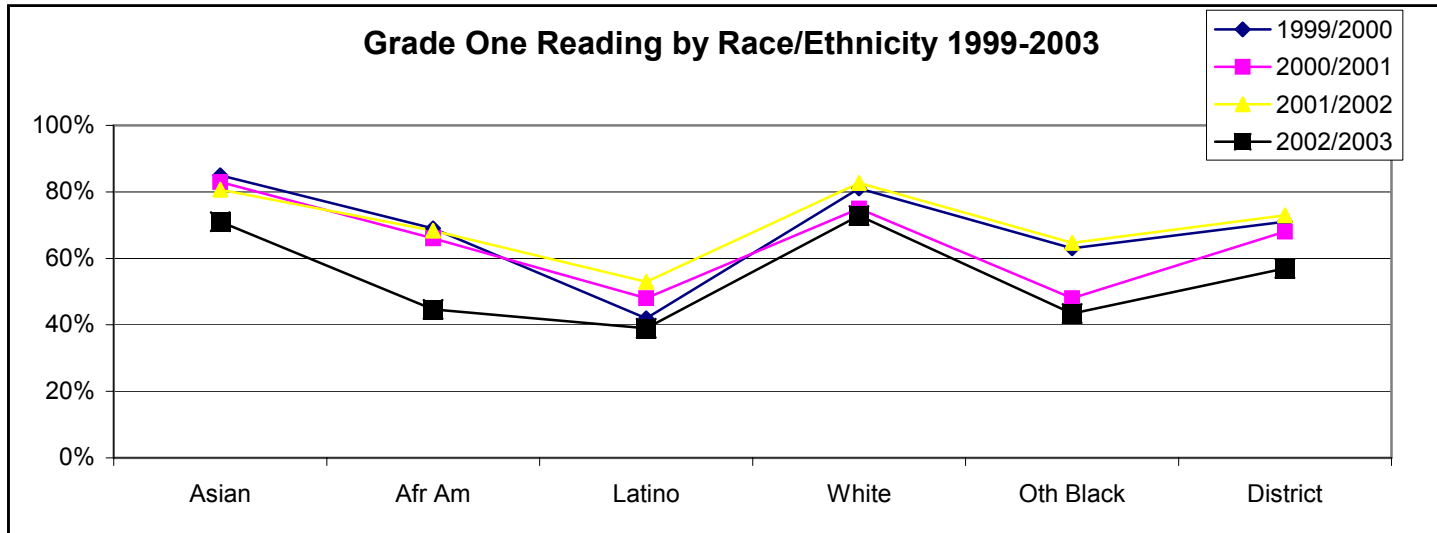

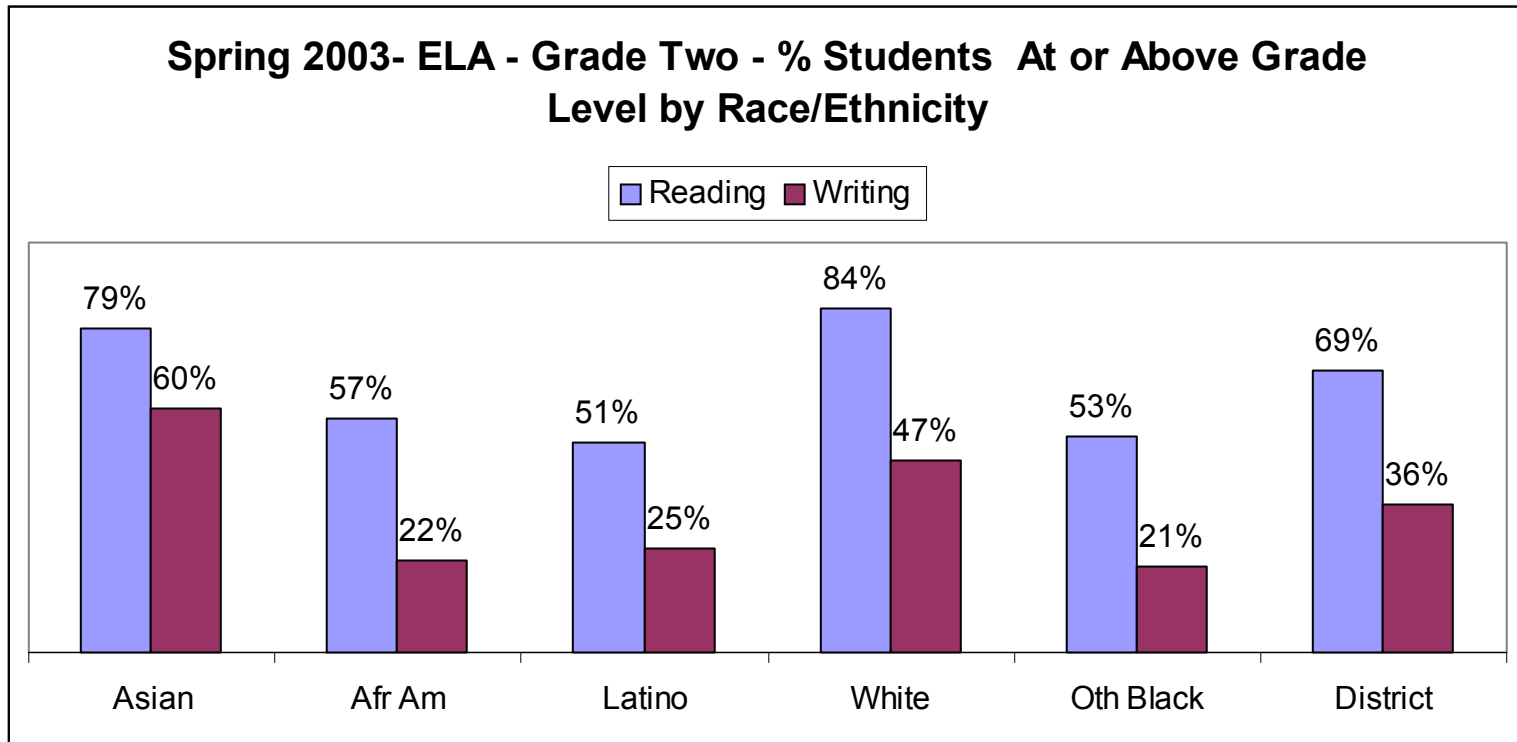

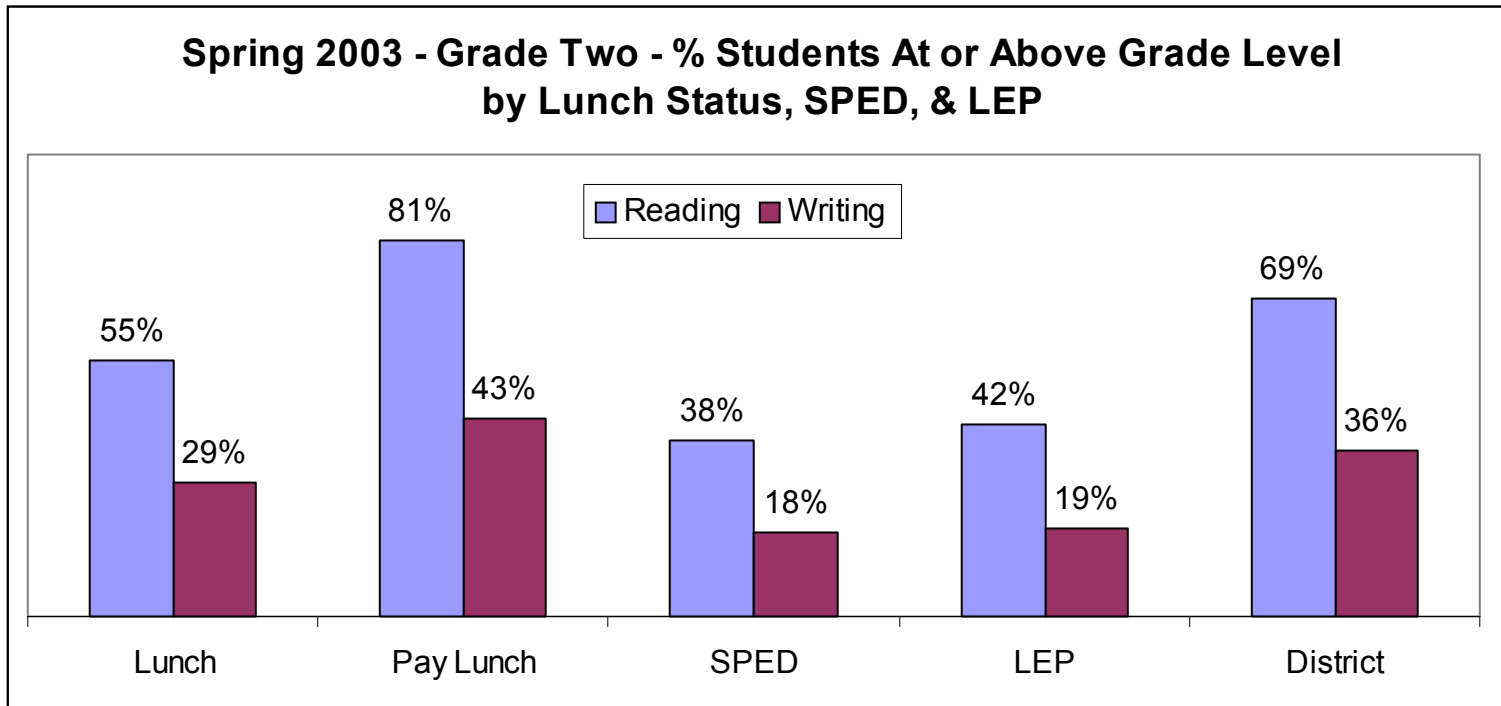

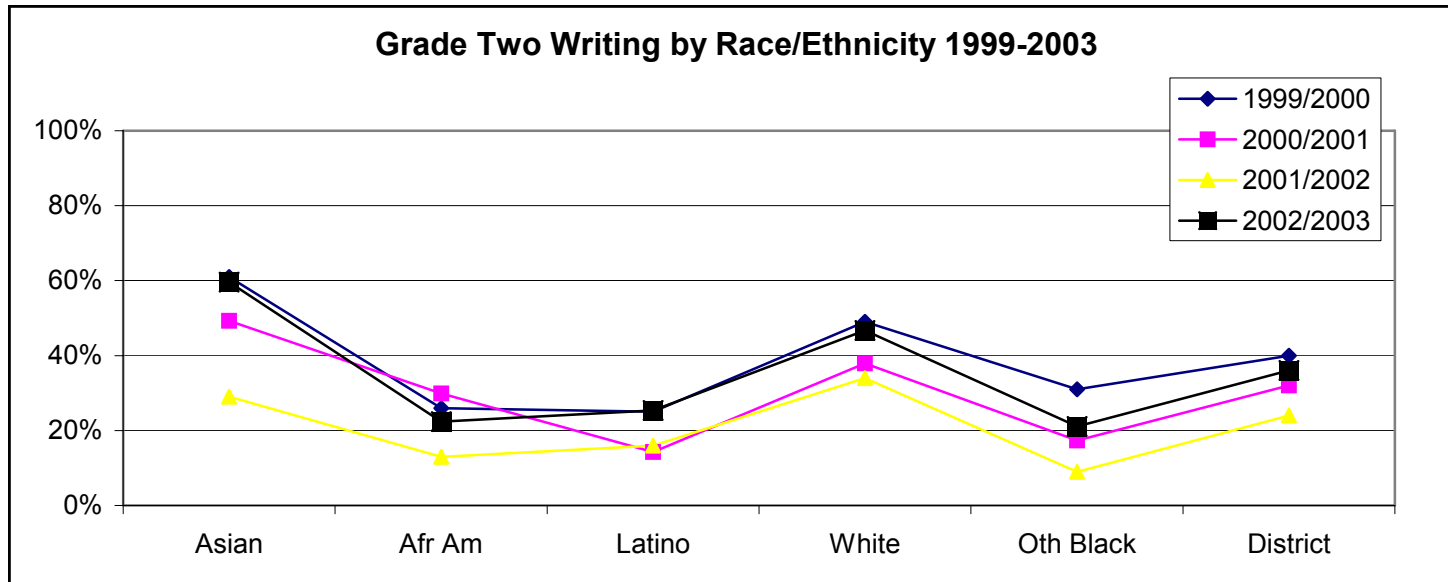
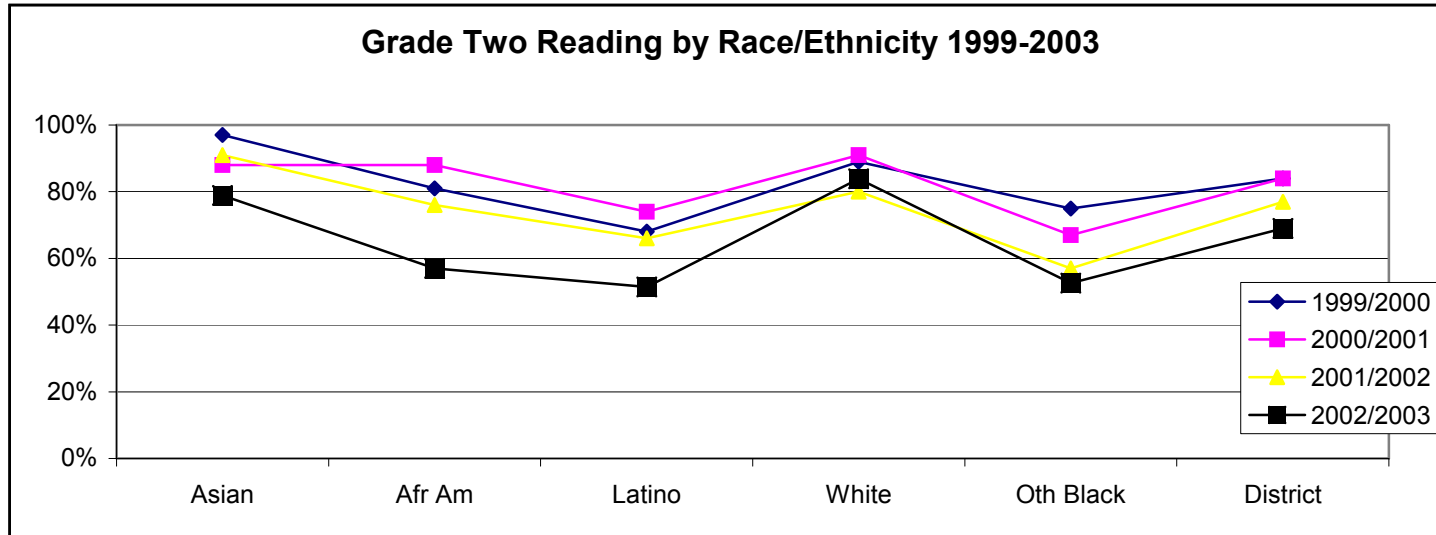

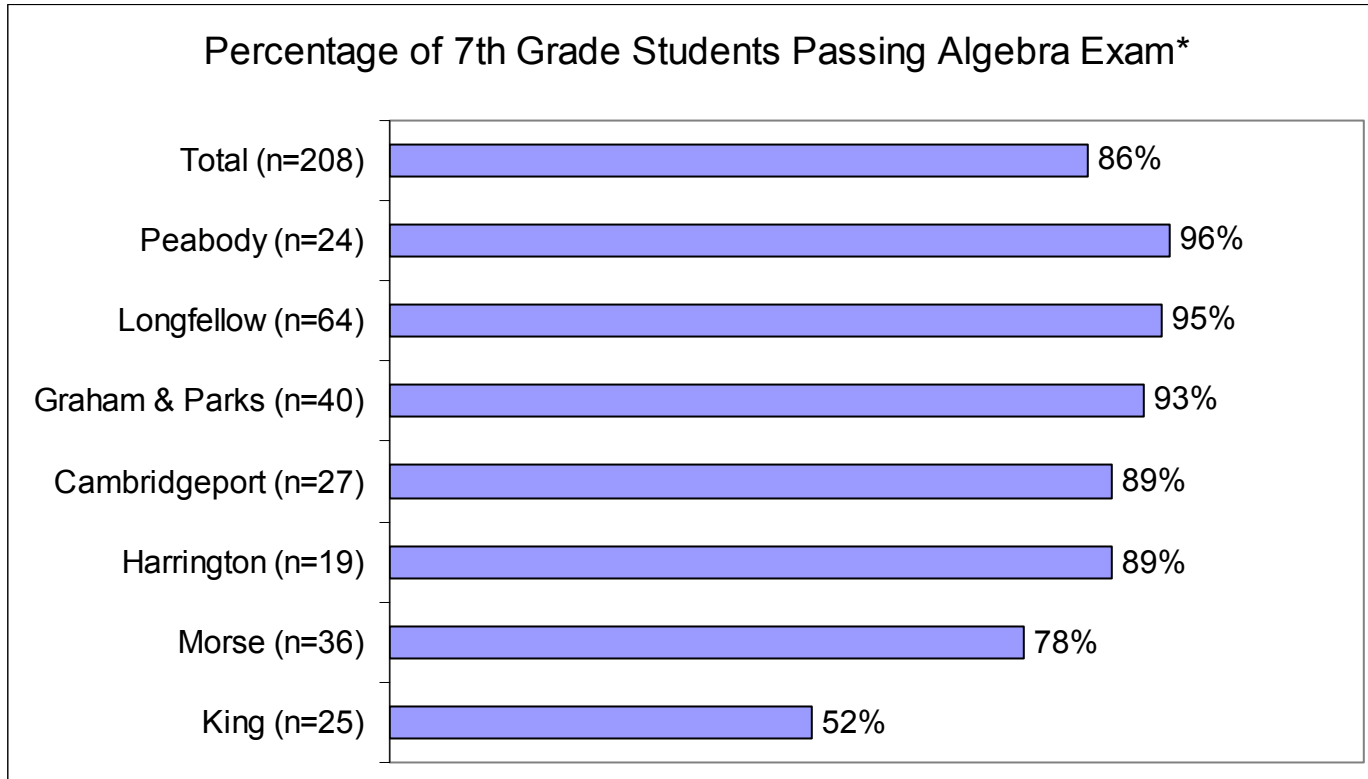

- In **2001/2002**, 84% of the students passed; in **2000/2001**, 91% of students passed and in **1999/2000**, 75% of students passed.



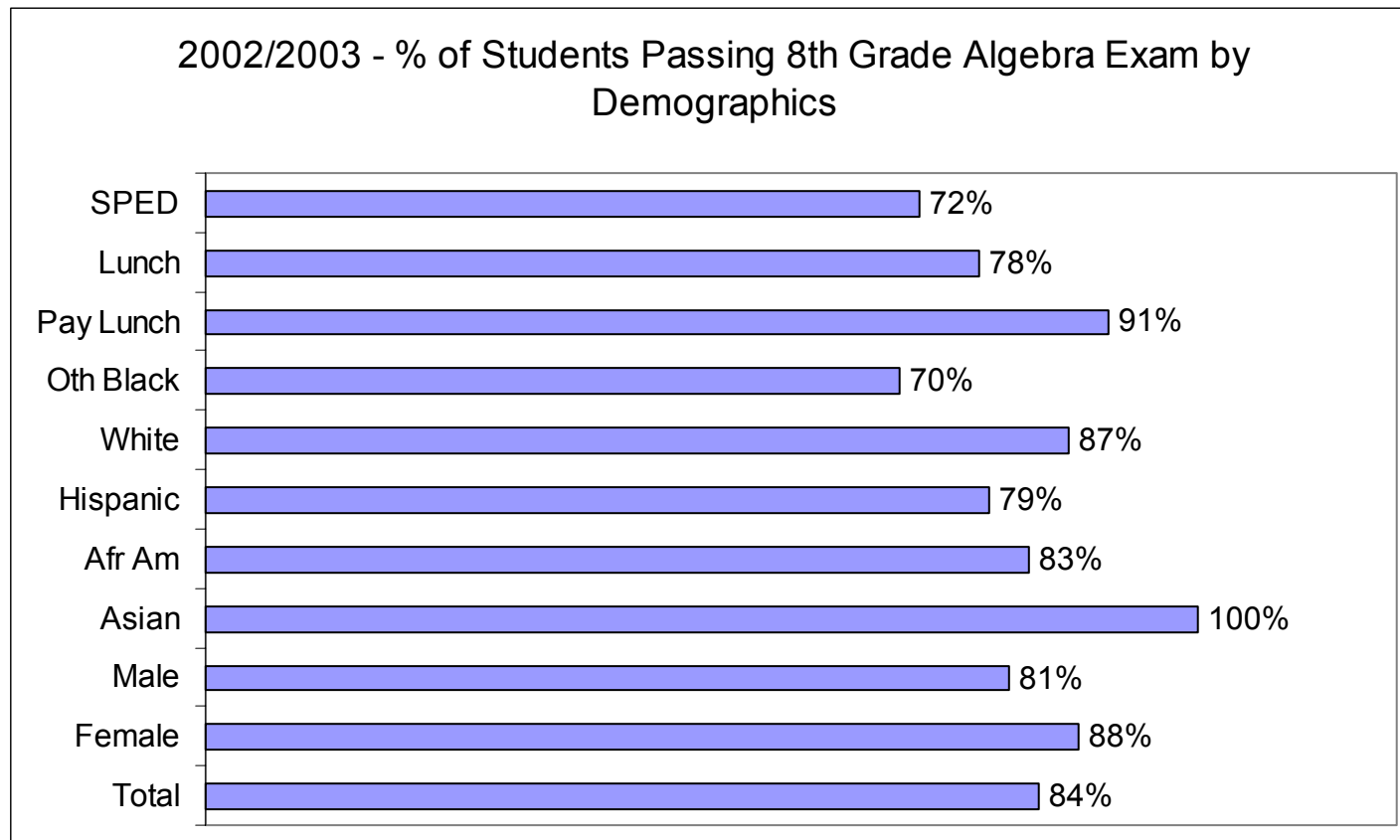
7th Grade Algebra Exam by School



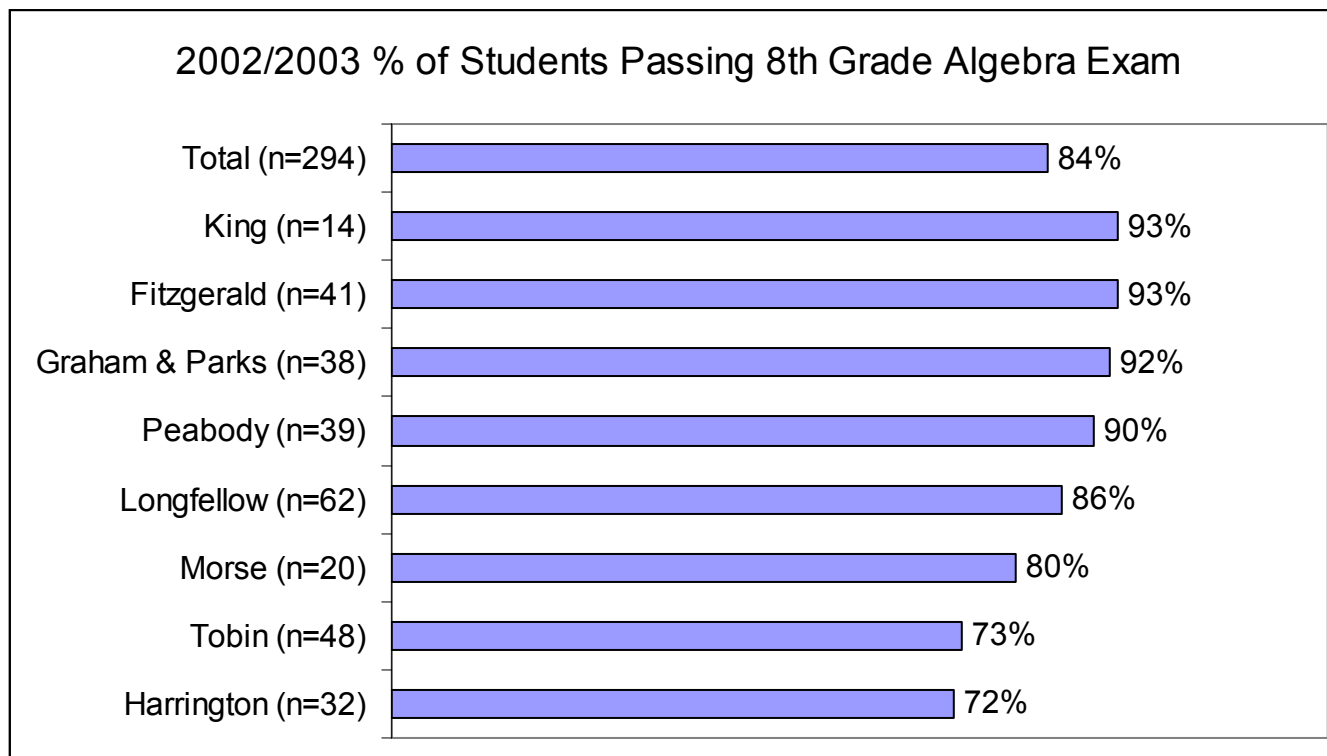
