Rules for a National History Day Annotated Bibliography

- Put citations in alphabetical order within each section of primary and secondary sources
- Double-space the entire document
- After the first line of a source citation, indent each subsequent line of that citation 1/2" from left margin
- Annotation follows citation directly without beginning a new line
- Annotation tells what information you found useful in the source and how you used that information in

your paper or project. Vary the language to introduce your annotation.
