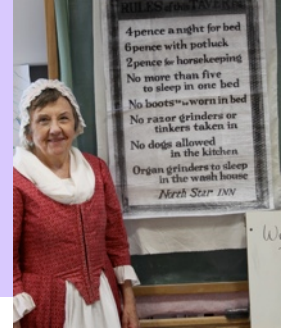

# Library Corner with Karen Kosko



## Historical Re-enactor Kate Carney Visits Haggerty

Kate Carney is an actor and has created several historical characters to present to school children. We invited Kate to take us back to the late 1700s to inform us on how life was like in Boston under King George III. Her character is the mother-in-law of the famous patriot, Paul Revere, named Rachel Walker. Her anecdotes also referred to the Inn that she and her husband ran. They were required to offer lodging to the redcoats so she was able to hear all sorts of information that the Sons of Liberty used as they prepared for their protests. Kate talked about collecting taxes and the evening of the Boston Tea Party- telling us the stories as if the stories had recently happened.



## Bryan Collier (Artist, Author, and Illustrator) Entertained Grades 4,5, and 6.

Bryan asked our students- 'when you first stepped out of your house, this morning- what color was the day?' Answers were shared and then he began to talk about noticing the details in our lives. He referred to opening up our imagination, and looking around with purpose.

Bryan Collier tried for 7 years to get his first book published. Since the publication of that book, "Uptown," his books have won several prestigious awards. He also brought some prints of his book "Dave the Potter: Artist, Poet, Slave," which was both a Caldecott Award Honor book and a Coretta Scott King Book Award winner. He also brought some original art to show the classes to explain his watercolor and collage techniques.

Bryan read aloud from 'Uptown' and 'Visiting Langston Hughes' and shared that he used himself as a model for 'the father' in the book about Langston Hughes ..and 'never again' he joked.

We thank ASP for their gracious donation of the tickets to this play through the NEA grant.



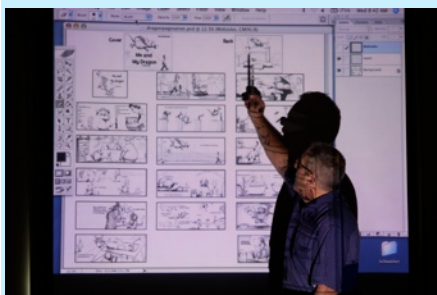
## Dave Biedrzycki - Artist, Author, Illustrator -Shows us the Tools of his Trade!

#### **Smoked Salmon Deviled Eggs**

*Delicious for breakfast, lunch (it works well in a lunch box!) or, along with bread and a salad, dinner. Also great party food.*

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- 6 large hard-cooked eggs
- 4 oz. cold-smoked salmon, very finely diced (about 1/2 cup)
- 1/4 cup thinly sliced fresh chives
- 1/4 cup mayonnaise
- 2 Tbs. minced red onion
- 2 Tbs. capers, rinsed and finely chopped
- 1 Tbs. fresh lemon juice
- 1/2 tsp. packed finely grated lemon zest
- Freshly ground black pepper

Peel and halve the eggs lengthwise. Remove the yolks and crumble them into a medium bowl. Add the salmon, 3 Tbs. of the chives, the mayonnaise, onion, capers, lemon juice, zest, and 1/8 tsp. pepper and mix. Mound the filling into the egg whites. Garnish with the remaining 1 Tbs. chives and several grinds of black pepper.

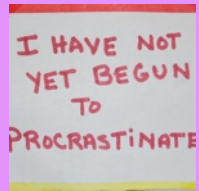
