### Salmon Roasted in Butter

Here's a quick and delicious way to prepare a salmon fillet.

One 2 to 3 pound salmon fillet (skin on or off)

1/4 cup (1/2 stick) butter

Salt and freshly ground pepper to taste

Parsley or dill, minced, for garnish

Preheat the oven to 475. Melt the butter in a roasting pan. Place the salmon in the butter, flesh side down, and put the pan in the oven. Roast about 5 minutes, then turn and roast about 5 minutes longer, until the salmon is done (use the end of a small, sharp-bladed knife to peek in to the middle of the salmon to see that it's done). Sprinkle with salt, pepper, and the garnish. Serve.
