Here are some examples of possible creative challenge projects:

- A letter written to an individual or group in African, African American, or Afro-Caribbean history who have helped to make our community, country, or world a better place.
- A speech proposing actions to address racism in our school, community, or society.
- A poster commemorating an important milestone, accomplishment, or contribution in African, African American, or Afro-Caribbean history or culture.
