What is Ramadan?

- Ramadan is the ninth month of the Islamic calendar, and is observed by Muslims worldwide as a month of fasting.
- ☐ It is considered a holy month Not an Islamic holiday.
- □ Ramadan is the month in which Quran(Muslim's Holy Book) was first revealed
- ☐ In Ramadan Muslims usually focus on prayers, fasting, giving charity, religious devotion, and extra worship.
- Ramadan is considered one of the highest communal time for Muslims during every year. (Gathering, Going to mosques, visitations, community services)

How Muslims Fast?

- Muslims abstain from eating and drinking from dawn to dusk every day for the entire month of Ramadan (30 days).
- □ However, young children, pregnant women, sick Muslims or Muslims on medications, or travelling are exempt from fasting.

Why Muslims Fast in Ramadan?

- Fasting Ramadan is one of the five pillars of Islam
- ☐ **Fasting** is an exercise in self-control, regulations and feeling the poor
- Muslims believe that Fasting is a way to physically and spiritually purify oneself.
- Ramadan is a very spiritual time for Muslims, and often they invite each other to one another's homes to break the fast and pray together. A greater sense of generosity and forgiveness is one of the characteristic of this month.
- ☐ This year, the first day of Ramadan will be around 4/2

Eid El Fitr

- At the end of Ramadan, Muslims celebrate one of their major holidays called Eid al-Fitr or the "Festival of the Breaking of the Fast
- Children traditionally receive new clothes, money or gifts from parents, relatives and friends.
- A special prayer is held the morning of Eid day, followed by a community celebration usually in a park or large hall with variety of activities.
- In 2022 the holiday will be held on May 3. In fact Cambridge Public schools is only district in MA that takes this day off.

Recommendations and Accommodations

- Announce Ramadan in your weekly update, school newsletter, Advisory announcements with a brief explanation about the month
- Greet Muslim students with "Ramadan Mubarak " at the beginning of the month
- Recommended HW duration: 30 min a day not more. Please, no HW over the weekend.
- Positively encourage Muslim students to work hard and meet the expectations all the time. Fasting Ramadan is not an excuse for less effort.
- Lunch/recess time and PE accommodations: plan with your team.
