**ORDERED:**

That the Superintendent's Proposed Reopening Model for the 2020-21 school year be adopted with contingencies as follows:

- That the School Committee approve the reopening model for the 2020-2021 school year as detailed in tonight's presentation contingent upon a routine testing and surveillance testing plan for anyone returning to classrooms implemented in conjunction with the Cambridge Public Health Department in place by August 24, 2020 and to be reviewed and approved by the School Committee.
- That the School Committee approve the reopening model for the 2020-2021 school year as detailed in tonight's presentation contingent upon a commitment to a frequent evaluation and adaptation of key metrics centered on equity and vulnerable populations disproportionately affected by COVID 19 (New Cases Per Day, Percent Positive Cases, and Sewage Monitoring with the Superintendent COVID-19 Task Force, Cambridge Public Health Department and Dr. Assad Sayah, Cambridge Public Health Commissioner, and CEO of Cambridge Health Alliance, and as data becomes available for other metrics that we will allow it to inform the metrics the district has put in place for reopening. Said metrics are placed prominently on the Cambridge Public School Website. Such metrics shall be presented to the public for their input and review on an ongoing basis, and reviewed by the School Committee by September 1, 2020 and on an ongoing basis.
- That the School Committee approve the reopening model for the 2020-2021 school year as detailed in tonight's presentation contingent upon adoption of the safety and facilities manual and ensure there are no spaces used that do not meet the requirements of our guidelines based on the independent engineering assessment.
- That the School Committee approve the reopening model for the 2020-2021 school year as detailed in tonight's presentation contingent upon the understanding that this vote is subject to change as the COVID-19 pandemic is fluid and changes to this reopening plan may be necessary at any point, to follow the emerging data and scientific evidence, and further, we must continue to improve upon centering the voices of educators, families, and scholars. The School Committee may call a special meeting at any point.

- That the School Committee approve the reopening model for the 2020-2021 school year as detailed in tonight's presentation contingent upon a plan for scholars in substantially separate programs co-created by special educators, families of those in substantially separate classrooms, with the administration and Covid-19 Task Force experts as scholars and professionals in these rooms are at greater risk of Covid-19 and face the greatest challenges to remote and in person learning.
- That the School Committee approve the reopening model for the 2020-2021 school year as detailed in tonight's presentation contingent upon a discussion with the City Council, Department of Human Services, and City of Cambridge on childcare options for families and educators during remote learning.
- That the School Committee approve the reopening model for the 2020-2021 school year as detailed in tonight's presentation contingent upon a co-created social emotional learning, mental and behavioral health plan for all scholars developed by educators, staff, out of school time professionals, scholars and families for in person and remote learning.
