Purpose: CRLS Workforce Program

Amount of Contract: \$127,355.00

Description/Scope of Services: The CRLS Work Force is a comprehensive educational enrichment, work-readiness, and college prep program for low-income teens in Cambridge public housing. Unusual for its depth of engagement with young people, the program currently provides 250 participants annually in grades 8 – 12 with sustained networks of learning and support over a developmentally significant five-year span: from the eighth grade through their senior year in high school. Since its inception in 1984, The Work Force has used what has since come to be known as a youth development approach, focusing more on building students' strengths rather than on ameliorating their deficits, to promote achievement in all the venues in which participants conduct their lives: at home, at school and at work. For over 30 years, The Work Force has helped low-income teens to broaden their horizons and to develop the wide range of competencies necessary for long-term success.
